1. The GenOn Portland coal-fired power generating plant emits 30,000 tons of sulfur dioxide each year contributing significantly to air and water pollution and asthma and other health effects in PA and NJ. IT NEEDS TO BE SHUT DOWN!

2. The Appalachian Trail and the Delaware Water Gap are in trouble. PSE&G has applied to the National Park to replace the existing 80' tall power lines with 195' monster towers.

These towers will bring electricity generated by more coal-fired plants and ruin the views and natural resources of this Wild and Scenic area. WE NEED TO TELL THE NPS "NO" TO ANY OF THE PROPOSED POWERLINES ROUTES!

3. Marcellus Shale drilling threatens our river and drinking water supplies. WE NEED TO STOP THE DRILLING EVERYWHERE!
