



## **\*Notice of Public BPU Hearings\***

PSE&G proposed upgrade of Susquehanna-Roseland project

Public hearings are scheduled as shown below – this is the opportunity for individuals along the line to come out and voice your concerns to the BPU about why you are opposed to this proposed project. It is crucial that you come and voice your concerns.

**This proposed project would affect ALL RESIDENTS OF NJ**, and has **not** been approved! The coal fired energy that would come across this line is not in the interest of the public, not consistent with NJ Energy Masterplan, and not reasonably necessary.

We recommend that you prepare a written statement outlining your concerns in a clear, concise way. Discuss how this proposal would directly affect you, your property values, children, safety, health, and the local environment. You may want to question why this line is needed, when demand has been decreasing over the past 2+ years. If you have an easement with PSE&G, question whether or not this expansion is allowed, based on your current easement. This would have major impact on quality of life. Question the allowable level of EMF's on your property. Recent studies show links between EMF's and increased occurrences of childhood leukemia, cancer, and other diseases. Discuss the major safety concerns with putting 190'+ high towers in a 150' wide right-of-way. Mention the fact that NJ is not interested in more coal generated energy – that recently approved local offshore wind projects and solar are a much better option, along with demand side management that decreases demand during peak energy usage. This project is completely contrary to what is outlined in New Jersey's Energy Master Plan. NJ Ratepayers are not interested in paying \$750 million or more for a project that is not necessary in this economic downturn – any potential "reliability" concerns should be addressed at the source.

Prepare your statement and read it to the BPU commissioner – it will become part of the record, so it should be concise and factual to the best of your knowledge. This is your right to have your voice heard, take full advantage of this opportunity!!!
